

A few people have inquired why the lunch count and grocery count are not the same number. There are two reasons for this. First, some people are unable to stay for lunch and they just register for groceries. Secondly, the groceries are distributed by households, not individuals. This monthly distribution is a mission our Church has provided for many years. We thank all of the volunteers who make this event successful.

The Mission Committee delivered Easter Treat Bags to eighteen of our Special Care Members. The Easter bags were packed with a small chocolate treat, bookmark, and a cute gingham magnetic butterfly. (Thank You to the Craft Group!) We would like to thank all of you who signed the Easters cards, too. They were greatly appreciated and brought a few tears, too. Your Easter wishes truly blessed those who received the cards.

The Mission Committee continues their outreach in the community. The money from the *Chili Cook-Off* will be donated to Trumbull Mobile Meals. It seems only right that we enjoyed the wonderful meal of chili that we should help the numerous people in our county who rely on the service Mobile Meals provides. The Mission Committee also plans to provide funds to Free Indeed for their Garden Program. The Deacons and Voices of Micah are joining forces to provide garden equipment. Free Indeed provides support and transition to men and women who are recently released from the prison system. Gardening is a very positive and caring activity. With our help, they will be able to increase their Garden Program. "To plant in the garden is to dream of a better tomorrow."

The Mission Committee is pleased to announce the Blessing Box is now installed by the office entrance. We would like to thank Buck Gillispie for his work in building this. The Deacons plan to supply the box with small items a person in need could use such as nonperishable food items, small hygiene items, and some clothing items. This box will be monitored, so items can be replenished when needed. The next time you come in the Office Door take a moment to look at the Blessing Box. The grant from the Sheely Foundation provided the funds for the construction of the box.

The Fellowship Committee is busy planning a few upcoming events. On May 11, they are hosting a reception after Church to celebrate the 2025 Communicants' Class. Please plan to stay after service that day and celebrate this special day. This Committee also plans to host the Juneteenth Reception after the Community Juneteenth Service on 6/19/25.
