

Finally, May has arrived and perhaps with it spring, since it hasn't snowed two Sundays in a row, as of this writing. Springtime usually means spring cleanup. My husband, Dave, and I get out and get really active in the yard this time of year, cleaning up branches and pinecones (our yard has a plethora of both strewn about this year), looking at what needs to be done as a result of winter wear and tear as well as projects we previously haven't got around to doing. Maintaining a house, like maintaining our faith, is a never-ending process.

I know Dave Skipper and the Building, Grounds, and Assets Committee have been doing the same—looking at the roof, preparing the lawnmower to cut the grass, uncovering the rose bushes, and checking out the air conditioning system. Maintaining a church, like maintaining our faith, is a never-ending process.

In June 2022, we will continue the long-term project of repairing the stained-glass windows in the sanctuary. Work has been ongoing since 2019, but this June we will finally see evidence of the work done under the leadership of Mary Ann Bromley and the Building, Grounds, and Assets Committee along with a special task force devoted to making this happen. Beginning in June, the plan is for Whitney-Stained Glass Company, experts in stained-glass window repair and installation, to come and remove a portion of the windows. This section will be replaced with plywood while the windows are restored and releaded. Sometime in the fall, the upgraded windows will be reinstalled and then a new section will be removed for work. This cycle will continue for a total of three times until all the windows, except one that doesn't need any work, are repaired. Gratitude is extended to those who have devoted time and energy to this transformation the last few years, and perhaps more importantly, to all the saints who in the past started and contributed to the Endowment Fund that is initially supporting our 50% of the cost. A grant from the United States Department of the Interior is supporting the other 50%. Maintaining a church building, like maintaining our faith, is a never-ending process.

This is an exciting time for this congregation and community—a time of hope, renewal, and transformation. A time to pause and give thanks. A time to realize that maintaining our faith is like maintaining our church building—a never-ending process.

As you read through the May edition of the "Spire", please look for opportunities for you to continue to renew and transform your faith in our triune God. Just as we plan our spring cleanup and home repairs, our medical appointments, and our vacations, we all need to plan time to devote to our faith through practices of fellowship, outreach and service, worship, and education and formation. Spend some time during spring cleanup removing any dust and cobwebs in your faith life, plant some seeds that will germinate and grow by committing a time each day to Christian reading, Christian meditation, or worshiping in the outdoors.

On April 18, the Deacons met to discuss plans and activities for Spring. The Mission Committee delivered Easter gifts to the residents at Someplace Safe. Target gift cards were given to the adults and older children, while the young children received an Easter toy and treat bag. I bet you didn't know that the Deacons will take part in the WORLD'S LARGEST DIAPER DISTRIBUTION. The nonprofit MKC (formerly Making Kids Count) provides necessities for children throughout NE Ohio, which allows struggling families access to infant supplies. The Deacons donated \$500.00 to this project to help them achieve a goal of 100,000 diapers in one week. During the past year over 33,000,000 diapers have been given to families. (That's a lot of "dry bottoms" !!!) The Committee also plans to make ten comfort bags for Trumbull County Children's Services.

Deacons also support causes on a global scale. A quick scroll of the news makes one realize that immigrants and refugees need help. The Beatitude House of Youngstown sponsors an Immigrant Outreach Program to benefit women and children with language classes and assistance with housing. The Deacons contributed \$300.00 to help with this program. This helps our Mahoning Valley community and casts a ray of hope in our unpredictable world.

Congregational Care delivered twelve Easter bags to our Special Care Members to brighten their holiday. Three packages were mailed to members who are now living away to be near family. We plan to send our college students gift cards to help ease the stress of final exams. Pastor Betty and Kathi Ensweiler are taking communion monthly to various homebound members.
