Grace and Peace Siblings in Christ,

This month we recognize some holidays with Mother's Day/Youth Sunday falling on May 12, and we observe some HOLYdays as we celebrate the Day of Pentecost on May 19 and Trinity Sunday on May 26. I am excited about Trinity Sunday because the lectionary brings us Isaiah's vision of heavenly worship, where the Seraphim are flying and singing "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD Almighty; the whole earth is full of his glory." God asks, "Whom shall I send to bring a message to the people?," and Isaiah responds, "Here I am; send me." Isaiah 6 and Revelation 4 give us images of the heavenly court worshiping God.

Isaiah and John both illustrate the worship of God as ongoing and everlasting, while we set aside a special time to break away from everything else and focus our attention on intentional worship of our Creator. So, what does that look like for us? I appreciate the morning fellowship period before our service as an opportunity to gather and greet one another. A fellow seminarian from another denomination encouraged the greeting period during his worship service, "How can I worship with you if I haven't even said 'good morning?'" Because we have the radio ministry, I try to keep us on track and avoid long periods of greetings before the call to worship. But if we were to do so, that is where I would place it in the service – after the announcements and before the call to worship.

You may notice that I begin the service each week with a specific choice of words. Usually, I say "Grace and Peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ." Other options I might say include "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it" or "I was happy when they said 'Let us go into the house of the Lord.'" These are all statements that remind us that we are in a special place and for a special purpose.

All the prayers, responsive readings, invitations to confess and offer our gifts, the music, and the sermon revolve around the Scripture for the day and support the message. As we move from one element to the next in our order of worship, we follow a pattern. We gather from prelude and call to worship through the confession and assurance of pardon. We hear the Word through Scripture reading and preaching of the sermon. We respond to the Word with our prayers and our tithes and offerings. Finally, we are sent out into the world with the charge and blessings.

Within the service, the passing of the peace can be placed in a few different areas. Traditionally, the passing of the peace was known as sharing a "holy kiss." After receiving the Lord's Supper, the congregation would turn to one another a give a small kiss. It was a way of passing along grace and forgiveness out of gratitude for Jesus sharing his meal (the body and blood of his sacrificial crucifixion) with us. Over time, the kiss was replaced with a simple phrase and response, "peace be with you," "and also with you." This gesture of offering Christ's peace to those gathered is a way of passing along what we have received and is also an opportunity to reconcile where there may have been tension. For that reason, the passing of the peace may follow the confession. It is also appropriate after the prayers of the people when we have lifted our praises and petitions for healing and reconciliation in the world.


What a joy and privilege it is to be able to come into this place and worship our God and continue passing the peace of Christ that was breathed upon the disciples so long ago.



The FPC Crafters made teacher appreciation gifts for the teachers at Willard School.




SACRAMENT OF COMMUNION Our next celebration of Communion will be *Sunday, May 5, 2024*, during our regular 10:00 a.m. worship service.

THE FIRST SUNDAY SPEAKER SERIES will be held on Sunday, May 5, at 11;15 a.m. in Fellowship Hall. The speaker will be Jerry Wolfe, an HIV Prevention Coordinator of the Warren City Health District. Jerry has been involved with the HIV/STI and the Risk Reduction community for over 12 years, primarily in outreach, advocacy, and education, and is a certified Ohio HIV/HCV counselor and tester. CLERK'S CORNER

At the regular standing meeting of Session held at 7:00 p.m. in Fellowship Hall on March 25, 2024, the following actions were taken:

- Confirmed an electronic vote taken on March 7, 2024, to approve a payment of \$17,000 from the IMA account to Masterpiece Painting for repair of water damage to the choir room, upstairs women's restroom, and hallway.
- Confirmed an electronic vote taken on March 11, 2024, to approve a remaining payment of \$26,672.79 from the Endowment Fund to Hercules Lighting to cover the remaining cost of the Sanctuary lighting project.
- Approved a motion for the McKee baptism to take place during worship on Sunday, April 28, 2024.
- Approved a bid for \$25,400 from Mega Roofing for removal of chimneys and replacing shingles over the choir room area.
- Approved a bid for \$27,500 from Steeplejacks of America for steeple repair and preventative maintenance.
- Received the February 2024 financial reports for audit.
- A motion was made and seconded to lift the requirement that Elders must serve on a minimum of two church committees; instead, they must chair or co-chair at least one.

The Session will be spending time at each meeting moving forward in the study of various sections of the Book of Order, so that they can familiarize themselves with the responsibilities associated with being an Elder as well as the basic tenets of our Presbyterian faith.

The next meeting of Session will be held on Wednesday, April 24, 2024, at 7:00 p.m. in Fellowship Hall. Rev. Kelly S. Lindsay will be moderating.
