Two significant all-congregation meetings happen in February

The month ahead has two significant meetings for members and friends of First Presbyterian Church. We hope both will get highlighted on your personal calendars.

Annual Business Meeting: February 15

Presbyterian churches, usually early in each year, hold an annual business meeting for the small number of functions which our form of governance reserves for the gathered members to decide. Our Session (council of ordained Elders) is likely to choose February 15 as the date, in conjunction with the Sunday morning worship service. The agenda, an annual report and other background information will be distributed separately by mail or email to our active members. (Non-members are always welcomed to attend, too.)



Supper and Vision-Casting: February 25

There will be a Wednesday evening for prayerful conversation and important discussions, as our ordained leadership boards meet together to identify the small handful of priorities which FPC will carry through the rest of 2026. While all Elders and Deacons will be the core of these conversations, please do not leave it solely to these folks to do the discernment. All the people of the congregation are eagerly invited to be part of this process. Everyone has something to add – newcomers, team leaders, long-time members, paid staff, the congregation at-large. All of us can benefit by listening to each other.

We'll provide a supper starting at 6:00 (and if you'll be later, arrive when you can and we'll feed you). The Rev. Barry Chance (the leader of our regional presbytery) will guide the small group and larger discussions, dreams and brainstorming across a couple of hours. You will be into the parking lot before 8:30.

From the Pastor: "Rooted Good"

Using the assets of the church to foster mission and connection

Four of us from FPCW traveled to Akron on a cold December evening, hoping to benefit from a presentation provided for us by our network of colleagues in Eastminster Presbytery. Mark Elsdon flew in (also through snow and delays) to teach multiple dozens of us about the successes he has fostered in an era when so many congregations are bogged down by building costs-and therefore curtailing multiple aspects of their local mission and ministry.

Thankfully, First Presbyterian Warren is not in dire straits to these levels, yet quite a number of our members previously were leaders in congregations where that painful process was all too real. Now, while this church is strong, some of our Elders find the "Rooted Good" process which Elsdon developed might become insightful, beneficial and inspirational to us as well.

I'll have more of my insights in an upcoming Sunday message, and our council of Elders may explore further study. For now though, the "TL;Dr" version of what "Rooted Good" helps each congregation explore is how to leverage current assets to foster mission work and community connections. Sure, a church has assets like buildings and real estate and bank accounts. Yet to expand our awareness of additional church assets reminds us of how valuable people and reputation and vision and relationships can be. Plus, unlike other "community organizations" we Christians always have available the assets of faith and calling and GOD'S PRESENCE to be invested in our present and our future!

The particular combinations for each church in each neighborhood/town/city will vary. Elsdon emphasizes that the "correct" answers cannot be "transplanted" in from outside—or even from a wise and successful consultant. The opportunities are unique and must be uniquely developed by a team which can build consensus in each place. The even better answers will not be our own decisions. They will enhance our vitality if/when they are developed in an ongoing conversation, when the church talks with and the listens to the surrounding community.

I look forward to seeing what 2026-20?? will become, carrying forward the best of our traditions while fostering life-changing, Jesus-honoring steps into God's vibrant future.
