MEET-N-EAT




Meet-n-Eat was held on Tuesday, October 14. A delicious taco bar was served and many of our youth attended.



SHARING OUR PRAYER CONCERNS (APPROPRIATELY)

One of the hallmarks of FPC Warren has been the compassion and support we mutually offer to each other. Yes, we have multiple other priorities too, but this pray-and-care emphasis has been strong here for a long, long time.

One of the challenges with it though is sharing timely information with each other, especially when there is a particular need or an update in someone's circumstance. Examples are: someone goes into the hospital; someone's surgery was successful; someone got a different diagnosis. While we certainly can pray for someone without knowing their specifics, compassionate people do want to speak to the Lord of the individual's need.

At a recent meeting, the Board of Deacons has agreed to a new mode of communication to be able to pass along congregational news. We have an e-mail group which gets "Prayer Chain" updates, but that circle is a small group for our midsized congregation. So, we are going to (1) increase the distribution of these prayer requests to more people, and (2) increase the content of such emails. With the help of others, I anticipate a regularly scheduled email, generally on Tuesdays. We can update the full congregation with requests that were shared Sunday, plus others which are shared by phone, texts, emails or social media. I foresee that some of these will also pass along not just a "hospital list," but also prayers for each other, even when it isn't about sickness but maybe when we need to be more grateful for blessings and joys! There will be prayers for upcoming FPC events, for local needs and items from a much broader geography, and the monthly list of churches and ministries on our regional Eastminster Presbytery prayer calendar.

Two added notes I feel I should share about prayer:

First, as was true at FPC prior to when I became your bridge pastor, we have not been announcing many specific names and diagnoses during our worship service. While many of us would be happy for a world-wide-web of Christians praying for whatever our request might be, there are also others who would prefer not to have their crisis or medical history or whatever else broadcast on the radio or our internet streams. In fact, while some of us might be happy for a small group of immediate friends and connections to know about some situation, some of us would rather not have it announced to dozens and dozens of worship attendees. (I've heard it said that there needs to be a distinction between "heartfelt prayer requests" and "churchy gossip!") So, to honor those who feel more tender about sharing, we will announce only those prayer updates which are appropriate to share and in these emails.

You can request to be included in these PRAYER CHAIN emails. (The subject line will always start with those two capitalized words, so the regularly-scheduled and occasional urgent updates) will stand out in your inbox. Send us an email [info@fpcwarren.org] if you wish to be added to the Prayer Chain and watch for these to begin during November.

Secondly, I have practical and theological reasons for us to erase (or at least diminish) the phrase "pastoral care" from our in-house vocabulary. I understand the traditional/common understanding of what that function is, but it is limiting. "Congregational care" is a better, more accurate, and more expansive goal. Yes, the pastor has a very significant role in providing prayer and care on behalf of the congregation, but this kind of mutual support happens in so many other ways and by so many other people. (How do we provide care, when there is no pastor in place? What happens in so many of our partnered churches that no longer have a pastor, and may not ever again?) I have the privilege of making caring visits and have done so these recent 7+ months and across 30 years of ministry. I will continue to do so. But YOU have, too! I know it; I've seen it; I've heard about it from the recipients of church members caring for church members. Ponder how this rewording might be appropriate for FPC moving forward.
