THE ALTERNATIVE GIFT-GIVING PROGRAM will continue through Dec. 18, 2022. Today's AGG spotlight shines on FPC Wish List – Stained-Glass Windows Project.

No one can look at FPC's stained-glass windows and not be overcome with emotion, as their beauty and intricate artistic detail serve as a constant source of meditation and reflection. Stained-glass windows are generally considered an outgrowth of Roman mosaics, which usually related a story through the use of colored tiles and glass shards. Originally referred to as the "Bible of the Poor," stained-glass windows would tell excerpts of Biblical stories, so that the poor, who usually could not read, could learn Scripture through this artwork. Symbolism was abundant, such as a dove representing the Holy Spirit and colors representing love (blue), death (black), and God (purple). As you sit in our beautiful sanctuary, look around and take in these pieces of art. Help us to restore and preserve the beauty of these historical windows by donating to the FPC Wish List.
