



The Presbyterian Church (USA) is a grassroots-led denomination. The Church's national policies and priorities are determined when our General Assembly meets for worship, debate and discernment. The "GA" meeting once every two years is also a spiritual high point for many who attend, with networking, idea sharing, and discovering first-hand more about the mission and the ministry of the PCUSA.

Eastminster Presbytery (like most of our 170 regional presbyteries) may send one Ruling Elder Commissioner, one Clergy Commissioner, and one Young Adult Advisory Delegate. Assembly committees will meet via Zoom on June 22-24 and the full assembly will meet in-person in Milwaukee on June 27-July 2. Those wishing to serve as a commissioner or delegate will need to be able to fully commit themselves to this process for the entirety of those dates.

* Reminder to all our youth members that the Seekers Lounge is available for use anytime.


Deacons' News

Pastor's Bible Study: September Sundays after worship

Come discover and discuss God's working presence in the world and in our lives. The curriculum, developed by the Presbyterian Church's national youth ministry, asks questions and then brings answers to these themes:

"See and Be Seen" (Psalm 139)

"Know and Be Known" (Luke 24:13-35)

"Bless and Be Blessed" (Psalm 23 and John 10:1-16)

Based in part on Matthew 25, this study not only looks for everyday evidence of God's activity, but it also challenges God's people to see "the other," the "least of these."

Some of our recent conversations with young people, plus the Christian Education team's summer survey, revealed an interest in offering events and classes that are intergenerational. Teens would like to have a Bible Study geared toward them, but also puts them into conversation and study with the grown-ups. This September series is a response to that request.

All ages are welcome. The class will meet on **September 14, 21, and 28.** (September 7 has our annual Rally Day festivities after worship.) Although each lesson does build upon the others, each is self-contained. You can benefit from each week, even if you cannot attend the entire series.

Right after the Sunday worship, spend a little time socializing in the Fellowship Hall. Grab a cup of coffee or water, then move to the Parlor for this class. Pastor Greg promoted this class as starting at 11:20 and ending by 11:59 a.m.

From the Pastor: Talking about Prayer

Speaking as someone with experience as a professional communicator (since my first year of 1980s college!), in broadcasting, and in ordained ministry, I have long used a truism about communication, both as a catchphrase and as personal marching orders:

"The myth about communication is that it is never done."

I like the wordplay of this sentence, with the double meaning of wondering if it "ever happens" AND if it is "ever completed." Obviously, there are some people who do not communicate - hard interpersonal connections, some Muslims and some Jews, some Republicans and some Democrats.

That interpretation concerns me, and the Church of Jesus needs to be active in fostering the trust that might encourage more of these people to cross those (supposedly) hard-and-fast boundaries.

For my purpose this month, I'm using the second interpretation. Even among people who communicate alright, there is always more to be done. Within our congregation here, a lot of people know each other, are up-to-date on church activities, and know whom to talk with to suggest an idea or get a question answered. While some of our updates on people and prayer requests are rightfully quiet or confidential, among a compassionate people like ours, there are times when people would like their "church family" to know about a crisis or a diagnosis or a celebration.

I anticipate we will roll out some enhancements in how we appropriately pass along prayer requests and related updates. We'll have more "communication" about this in the coming weeks. In the meantime, thank you for being people of prayer. Sure, we will keep praying for our "hospital list." Yet the good news is: even if we don't know details about someone's circumstance, God does. For now, do some prayerful communication. Start at your own name in the church directory; on a regular basis, work through that list, so that every individual and household is lifted up in prayer. Even someone who is not front-and-center in the stereotypical ways we often list our prayer concerns, everyone of us would like to have someone "communicating" with God on our behalf.

I'm not "done" talking about this truism. Stay tuned!
