Forty-two people enjoyed soup and a baked potato bar, followed by a program on the folk tale "Stone Soup".




Ray retired as Clerk of Session after many years. A reception was held to honor and thank Ray for his dedication and service to FPC.

CLERK'S CORNER



During the Session meeting on November 16, the following actions were taken:

Marjorie Dangaran and Dottie Hope were examined to fulfill unexpired one-year terms on the Board of Deacons and the Endowment Committee respectively. They will be installed during worship on 12.11.22.

Approved a motion from the Safety and Security Working Group to cover the costs associated with training 12 people from the congregation in First Aid, CPR, AED, and Stop the Bleed.

Set the date of the Annual Congregation meeting for 2.12.23. Annual committee reports will be due to Kathie Trowbridge no later than 1.27.23.

Set the date for an Officers' Retreat to take place 2.10-11.23 at the Church. All officers are asked to participate.

Approved a motion from Building, Grounds and Assets for Denna HVAC to provide preventative maintenance by cleaning out all the traps in the Church's heating system.

Approved a motion from Building, Grounds and Assets to have Dickey Electric replace three parking lot pole lights that are currently burned out with LED lights.

Approved a motion from the Finance Committee revising the offering counting policy to include members of the Board of Deacons on the first Sunday of the month, when Two Cents A Meal is collected.

Approved a motion from the Finance Committee to recognize John Taylor as Acting Treasurer for a one-year term.

Approved a motion from the Finance Committee designating that the 2023 parking lot revenue collected from the Amp concerts and other community events be split as follows: 50% to the Deacons Income line item to be used for local mission giving and 50% to general operating expenses.

Recommended to the Finance Committee that donations to line items 93-96 in the proposed 2023 budget are increased as follows: Presbytery Missions Expense from \$1,200 to \$2,000; Synod Mission Expense from \$600 to \$1,000; General Assembly Mission Expense from \$600 to \$1,000 and Theological Education Expense from \$600 to \$1,000.

The next meeting of Session will take place on 12.14.22 at 7:00 pm in Fellowship Hall.

As we enter the Holiday Season, the Board of Deacons continues to plan events and projects. We strive to support the needs of our congregation and the community outside of our church walls.

The Annual Founders' Day Dinner was celebrated on November 20. The Saratoga prepared 126 delicious meals. This "drive thru" event allowed the Fellowship Committee to collaborate with the Advent Committee for the distribution of Advent materials and Love Tree Tags.

The Mission Committee continues their outreach to the community. Someplace Safe received help with kitchen supplies and food staples to stock the pantries as women and their children transition to safe homes. (This mission truly supports the old adage - "the Kitchen is the Heart of a Home".) The Warren YWCA housing "WINGS" greatly benefited from our donations of cleaning and paper supplies. This housing complex is less than a mile from our Church and provides shelter to women with disabilities and their children who are at risk of homelessness.

The Congregational Care Committee coordinated the 50+ year members recognition on Founders' Day. Fifty-eight members were recognized for their membership in our congregation. The Committee plans to distribute a Christmas gift to our Special Care members during December.

The monthly Grocery Distribution took place on November 15. Thanksgiving was "in the air" with numerous turkey casseroles in the oven and freshly baked pumpkin breads all prepared for the 115 lunches that day. The distribution was busy with 47 families receiving a large grocery order with many items to help them prepare for Thanksgiving. Thank You for all who helped this distribution.
