BETTY'S IOYFUL NOISE

Our Lenten journey has begun as we travel through the wilderness to the cross and then beyond to the empty tomb at Easter. I look forward to the time that I can say "Alleluia!" after the Assurance of Pardon during worship. The tradition is to refrain from using this expression of joy during this 40-day Lenten period.

On Ash Wednesday, the Church again offered drive-through ashes underneath the portico during the lunch hour and late afternoon. The time was very special. The majority who drove through were not church members but community residents. Some spoke about how this was the second or third year of attending and that it was such a gift in their lives: the weather was rainy, their spouse was recovering from surgery, or their church didn't offer imposition of ashes. I blessed grandmoms and their toddler granddaughters, Catholics (afterwords, we talked about worshiping the same God) and one woman who was hesitant to enter the big church building and used this as an opportunity to check out the pastor. I am praying that she was put at ease with our interaction, so that she will return and come inside next time.

Perhaps the most touching story from this time that I can share is about a twenty something young man who was using the portico to stay dry and use his cell phone. If you recall, the day was cold, dreary, and damp—bone chilling, actually. After a while of letting the man communicate on his phone. I asked him if he would like to receive ashes. He looked at me quizzically. We talked about the ashes and the practice of imposition. I asked again about him receiving the sign of the cross on his forehead. With a sheepish smile, he looked at me and agreed. As I anointed him with the oil and the ash, I silently prayed for God to guide his life and make the Lord's presence known to this man, while I said the traditional words of imposition and prayer. After we finished, he apologized for the smell of alcohol and then asked, "Do you think the ashes will help?" I responded confidently, "I believe God loves us - you and me. I believe God wants the best for each of us. Yes, I believe God will help."

At the February officers' retreat, we spoke about being a presence in the community through various and different ministries. We also talked about loving people because Jesus loves us. God calls us to be the light on the square. Whether we are shuttling groceries in carts out to cars or placing ashes on foreheads, or handing out cookies at Willard School's Parents' Night, when we engage with community residents through word and deed, we are sharing the love of Christ. We are being the presence of Christ in the community.

In the next 40 days, can you be that presence in this community? Can you be the light in the darkness or a way to help get through the wilderness? How is God calling you this Lenten season to turn to the Lord and draw closer to God?



During the regular standing meeting of Session held on February 22, 2023 in Fellowship Hall, the following actions were taken:

- Approved the membership roll at 224 with the removal of Janice and Thomas Semple to the First Christian Church of Niles.
- Confirmed the electronic vote of February 14, 2023, to hire a part-time facilities assistant, Jennifer Procner, at \$15/hr and no paid benefits.
- Approved a motion from Voices of Micah 6:8
 regarding a permanent placement for their book
 cart, which houses books related to social justice issues and acts as a lending library for
 church members to educate themselves. The
 motion carried and the book cart will be located
 under the Small Groups Sign-Up bulletin board
 in Fellowship Hall.
- Approved a motion from the Building, Grounds and Assets Committee to repair additional leaking steam pipes. The cost of the repairs to the two pipes, one for \$805 and the other for \$7335, will be taken from the Endowment Fund as approved by the Finance Committee.
- The Christian Education Committee announced that four young woman will be part of the next Confirmation Class, which will begin on February 28, 2023. The class will be held on Tuesdays from 5-6:30 pm. The class will be confirmed on Mother's Day, May 14, 2023.
- Approved receipt of the financials from January 2023.
